Preface

Women play a pivotal role in the overall progress of a country as they constitute half the human resources of a nation. The economic wealth of a country is seriously depleted if about half of the nation's human resource is neglected. Recognising the need for involving women in various development activities, the Government of India has initiated several affirmative measures by way of programmes and schemes to bring them into the mainstream of development. These affirmative actions have brought about perceptible changes in the socio-economic conditions of women. The literacy rate of females, which was 8.86% in 1951 rose to 54.16% in 2001. Women's work participation rate, which was 19.7% in 1981, rose to 25.7% in 2001. The data base also brings out the areas where the progress has been slow if not retrograde. The sex ratio in the 0-6 years age group dropped from 945 in 1991 to 927 in 2001, which indicates that society still does not welcome a girl child and the preference rests with sons. Nearly 50% women get married before they attain 18 years of age, and 57.9% pregnant women and 56.2% married women suffer from anaemia. Maternal mortality rate (MMR) is still quite high, at 254 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births (in 2006). Thus, there is room for much more to be done to ameliorate the plight of women at the grass root level.

The Eleventh Five-Year Plan aims to achieve inclusive growth and reduce disparities. A comprehensive picture of Women and Girls in India as revealed through collected statistics would be a useful reference base to show the progress India has achieved so far. This document is an effort to capture statistically the situation of women and girls in India, on the basis of many social indicators which are available in widely scattered sources. Various indicators covered in this document are : demography and vital statistics; health and nutritional status; education; girl child; work participation of women and children; support measures for women, including women in distress; political participation of women and women in decision making; prevalence of disability; crime against women and children; food security; household expenditure; budget outlays for women in the Union Budget and Budget of the Ministry of Women and Child Development; and voluntary organisations involved in the social development activities.

The document has been compiled with the efforts of a team of officers and staff of the Institute. Dr. Sulochana Vasudevan, Joint Director, Women's Development Division, provided support and guidance to a team headed by Ms. Meenakshi Sood, and comprising Ms. Himani Nautiyal, who have painstakingly compiled and updated the information and statistics several times over. While Shri Varun Kumar provided computer assistance, Shri A. J. Kaul, Publications Officer and other officials of the Common Services Division

were instrumental in ensuring the timely publication of the document. I acknowledge with gratitude the contribution of various Government Departments, autonomous organisations, UN agencies, international organisations, research institutes and voluntary organisations, who extended full cooperation and shared their documents with us.

The document shows at a glance statistics on indicators which are available in various published sources. We have put in the effort with the hope that this document would be a useful asset to administrators, planners, researchers, academicians, media persons, and others concerned with issues related to women's empowerment.

1. Measures for Women's Empowerment

Introduction

India attained freedom from British rule on 15th August 1947. India was declared a sovereign Democratic Republic on 26th January 1950. On that date the Constitution of India came into force.

All citizens of India are guaranteed social, economic and political justice, equality of status and opportunities before law by the Constitution. Fundamental freedom of expression, belief, faith, worship, vocation, association and action are guaranteed by the Indian Constitution to all citizens- subject to law and public morality.

The Constitution of India - Provisions Relating to Women

The Constitution of India not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women for removing the cumulative socio-economic, educational and political disadvantages faced by them.

Advancement of Women through Five Year Plans

There has been a progressive increase in the plan outlays over the last six decades of planned development to meet the needs of women and children. The outlay of Rs. 4 crores in the First Plan (1951-56) has increased to Rs. 7,810.42 crores in the Ninth Five Year Plan, and Rs. 13,780 crores in the Tenth Five Year Plan. There has been a shift from "welfare" oriented approach in the First Five Year Plan to "development" and "empowerment" of women in the consecutive Five Year Plans.

Perspectives on Advancement of Women through Five Year Plans

First Five Year Plan (1951-56)	It was mainly welfare oriented as far as women's issues were concerned. The Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB) undertook a number of welfare measures through the voluntary sector. The programmes for women were implemented through the National Extension Service Programmes through Community Development Blocks.
Second Five Year Plan(1956-61)	Efforts were geared to organise "Mahila Mandals" (women's groups) at grass-roots levels to ensure better implementation of welfare schemes.
Third, Fourth, Fifth and other Interim Plans (1961-74)	They accorded high priority to women's education. Measures to improve maternal and child health services, and supplementary feeding for children, nursing and expectant mothers were also introduced.

Sixth Five Year Plan (1980-85)	This is regarded as a landmark in women's development. The Plan adopted a multidisciplinary approach with a three-pronged thrust on health, education and employment of women.
Seventh Five Year Plan(1985-90)	Development programmes for women were continued, with the objective of raising their economic and social status and bring them into the mainstream of national development. A very significant step therein was to identify and promote "beneficiary-oriented programmes" which extended direct benefits to women.
Eighth Five Year Plan(1992-97)	It attempted to ensure that the benefits of development from different sectors did not bypass women. Special programmes were implemented to complement the general development programmes. The flow of benefits to women in the three core sectors of education, health and employment were monitored vigilantly. Women were enabled to function as equal partners and participants in the developmental process with reservation in the membership of local bodies. This approach of the Eighth Plan marks a definite shift from 'development' to empowerment' of women.
Ninth Five Year Plan(1997-2002)	<p>The Ninth Five Year Plan envisaged :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Empowerment of women and socially disadvantaged groups such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes and Minorities as agents of socio-economic change and development. b) Promoting and developing people's participatory institutions like Panchayati Raj institutions, cooperatives and self-help groups. c) Strengthening efforts to build self-reliance. d) The convergence of services from different sectors. e) A women's component plan at the Central and State levels.
Tenth Five Year Plan(2002-2007)	The Tenth Five Year Plan was formulated to ensure requisite access of women to information, resources and services, and advance gender equality goals.
Eleventh Five Year Plan(2007-2012)	The Eleventh Five Year Plan proposes to undertake special measures for gender empowerment and equity. The Ministry of Women and Child Development would make synergistic use of gender budget and gender mainstreaming process.

Programmes for Women

- Swawlamban, the erstwhile Training-cum-Employment Programme for Women provides skill training to women to facilitate their employment or self- employment on a sustained basis in traditional and non- traditional trades. Till December 2002, 902 projects including 262 continuing projects benefiting 58,458 women were sanctioned. With effect from 1.4.2006, Swawlamban is being transferred to the States. During 2005-06, 7660 beneficiaries availed benefits under the scheme.
- The Department has initiated the gender budgeting exercise to assess the impact and outcome of Government spending on Women. Gender Budget Cells have been set up in 9 Departments/Ministries namely, Health, Family Welfare, Elementary Education and Literacy, Labour and Employment, Rural Development, Social Justice and Empowerment, Tribal Affairs, Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation and Small Scale Industries.

- Measures have been initiated for preparing Gender Development Index for the States and Districts.
- Swayamsiddha, an integrated scheme for women's empowerment, is based on the formation of women into Self Help Groups (SHGs) and aims at the holistic empowerment of women through awareness generation, economic empowerment and convergence of various schemes. Against the target of 65,000 SHGs, 69,803 Women's Self Help Groups have been formed, covering a total of 1.002 million beneficiaries till 2008. The scheme ended on 31.03.2008.
- Support and Training for Employment Programme (STEP) provides updated skills and new knowledge to poor and asset-less women in traditional occupations for enhancing their productivity and income generation. A package of services such as training, extension, infrastructure, market linkages, etc. is provided besides linkage with credit for transfer of assets. Since its inception in 1987, about 0.8 million women have been covered under various projects till 2008-09. Since 2005-06, each year between 31,000 to 40,000 women benefit under STEP. So far women in dairy sector have received maximum support keeping in view the nature of demands. This is followed by handlooms, handicrafts, sericulture, piggery and poultry.

Working Women's Hostels

- 876 Working Women's Hostels have been sanctioned benefiting 63,989 women, with 321 having Day Care Centres, benefiting 8442 children in 2009.

- Comprehensive review of legislation affecting women has been undertaken by Sub-Groups formed under the Task Force on Women and Children.



Birth Registration

A birth certificate is the first legal document confirming identity of the individual. In India, the registration of births and deaths is compulsory under the Registration of Births and Deaths (RBD) Act of 1969. The National Population Policy 2000 has set the goal of achieving universal birth registration by the year 2010. The registration of births of children in India is given in Table 14.

Total marital fertility rate (TMFR) is the cumulative value of age specific marital fertility rates at the end of the reproductive period. It indicates the average number of children expected to be born per married woman during the entire span of her reproductive period, if the ASMFR continues to be the same and there is no mortality. The TMFR worked out on the basis of ASMFR for the year 2006 and 2007 for India and bigger states for rural and urban areas is given in Table 26.

3. Girl Child

Although the Constitution of India guarantees equality to all citizens, the status of women and girls is not at par with that of males in some sections of society. The skewed sex ratio in the 0-6 years age group is an indicator of this fact. The Government of India has launched several schemes and programmes for the welfare of the girl child, and reduce discrimination against the girl child. Some of these are:

4. Early Marriage

Early marriage is defined as a marriage in which the bride is below 18 years and the groom is below 21 years. Girls who bear children before they close their adolescent growth spurt remain physically under developed and have greater risk of complications of pregnancy and maternal death. To reduce the incidence of child marriage, the Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929 was passed and amended in 1979, 2006 and 2008.

Under this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context, (a) "child" means a person who, if a male, under 21 years of age and if a female, is under 18 years of age ; (b) "child marriage" means a marriage to which either of the contracting parties is a child; (c) "contracting party" to a marriage means either of the parties whose marriage is or is about to be thereby solemnised; and (d) "minor" means a person of either sex who is under 18 years of age.

Punishment under the Act: Whoever performs conducts or directs any child marriage shall be punishable with simple imprisonment which may extend to three months and shall also be liable to fine, unless he proves that he had reason to believe that the marriage was not a child marriage.

The Child Marriage Act was amended in 2006 and the guardian who solemnizes a child marriage can be punished with rigorous imprisonment which may extend to two years and also be liable to fine which may extend up to rupees one lakh. However, no woman can be imprisoned. Any person who attends a child marriage can also be penalized under the Act.

Under the latest amendment in 2008, a girl who is forcibly married below 18 years can approach the court to declare her marriage as null and void if she so desires.

Legislative Measures

To reduce and eliminate the incidence of child marriage, the following act has been enacted:

1. Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929 (Amended in 1979, 2006 and 2008).

Although the incidence of early marriage has come down from 50% in 1998-99 (NFHS-II) to 44.5% in 2006 (NFHS-III) for India as a whole, the incidence of early marriage remains above 60% in rural areas of Jharkhand (71.0%), Rajasthan (65.7%), Bihar (65.2%), West Bengal (62.6%), Madhya Pradesh (62.0%), Andhra Pradesh (61.4%), Uttar Pradesh (61.1%) and Chhattisgarh (60.3%).

Census of India 2001 found that there were nearly 300,000 married girls who became mothers before the age of 15 years. Early motherhood places the mother and the child at grave health risk. The incidence of early marriage and early motherhood is given in Table 32.

5. Child Labour

Children who are working before they attain the age of 14 years are termed as child labour. The Government enacted "The Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act", 1986 to prevent the employment of children in hazardous industries or in hazardous processes. A high powered body, the National Authority for the Elimination of Child Labour (NAECL), was constituted in September 1994 to lay down policies and programmes for elimination of child labour, particularly in hazardous industries. In 1996, the Supreme Court issued a directive ordering the setting up of a corpus fund "Child Labour Rehabilitation-cum-Welfare Fund" with Rs.25,000 to be contributed by the employer of a child in a hazardous industry, towards the compulsory primary education of all working children.

In 1981, out of a total population 685 million, working children were 13.6 million, which was about 2 per cent of the total population. In 1991, out of a total population of 838.6 million, working children were 11.28 million, which was 1.34 per cent of the total population.

As per Census of India 2001, there were 12,666,377 child labourers in India. Out of the total working population of 402,234,724 workers, including main and marginal workers, working children constituted 3.15% of the total labour force. Out of a total population of 1.028 billion persons in India working children numbered 12.666 million, which was 1.23% of the population.

Child Labour Act has been amended in 2001 and the scope of the Act has been extended to prohibit employment of children in 70 hazardous occupations and processes, including rag-picking and scavenging. In 2006, employment of children in domestic work and hotels was included in the list of occupations where the employment of children was banned.

6. Health and Nutrition

For a nation's progress, it is essential that the health of its population, including the health and nutrition of women and girls, mothers of the new generation, is adequately cared for. Although the expectation of life at birth for women has increased from 36.1 years in 1951 to 66.91 years in 2001-06, the health and nutritional status of women and girls leaves much scope for improvement. The dietary intake of women in low economic group was deficient by 500 to 600 calories. Other factors influencing the poor status of women and girls are unsafe drinking water, inadequate sanitation facilities, poor hygiene and housing conditions in rural and urban poor areas, disproportionate workload, physical and mental violence, etc. Information on a few health and nutrition indicators is given in the subsequent tables.

Rural Health Infrastructure

The rural health infrastructure in India is often plagued with inadequate resources of trained manpower, equipment, medicines, electricity and transport. To reduce the high maternal mortality rate of 254 per 1,00,000 live births, rural health infrastructure needs strengthening. In 2005, National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) has been launched to provide improved health care services in rural areas. Under NRHM, Janani Suraksha Yojana (scheme) provides improved health care facilities to pregnant women, creates awareness about care of mothers during pregnancy, promotes safe deliveries, and provides cash or transport facilities to reach women to maternity clinics. The number of health centres, and trained personnel available in rural areas is given in Table 43.

Maternal Health Care

The maternal mortality rate (MMR) of developed countries ranges between 4 and 20. India's maternal mortality rate of 254 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births is unacceptably high and all efforts are being made to increase the number of institutional deliveries, so that emergency medical services can be provided when needed. Rural areas lack all weather roads and transport services, blood banks, operation theatres and other support services. The aim must be to ensure that every delivery takes place in a hospital. The incidence of institutional delivery and assisted delivery is given in Table 44.

The death rate in India in 2008 is 7.4 per 1,00,000 population, as per statistics from the Vital Statistics Division of the Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India (October 2009). The death rate in rural and urban areas is 8.0 and 5.9 per 1,00,000 population respectively. Infant mortality is a sensitive indicator showing the level of human development of a nation. Efforts are being made to bring down IMR to below 30 per 1000 live births as per the Millennium Development Goals set for 2010 A.D. The major share of infant mortality is contributed by neonatal mortality, which is the death of infants from birth to 28 days. Infant Mortality and Child Mortality

The infant mortality rate (IMR) in India has been coming down over the years and was recorded at 53 per 1000 live births in 2008, as is given in Table 16. Although efforts are being made to bring down IMR to 30 by 2010, the rate of decline in recent years has slowed down. Efforts are required on various fronts and the National Rural Health Mission is endeavouring to achieve this goal by creating awareness among women about the importance of antenatal and post natal visits to hospitals and various health facilities to monitor the progress of the new born child. The percentage distribution of top ten killer diseases of infants in rural India is given in Table 54.

AIDS Cases in India

AIDS has emerged as a major killer in India. The incidence of AIDS is spreading from the high risk population to the general population, and the infection has even been transmitted to newborn babies through infected mothers. It is estimated that in 2007, there are 2.31 million (1.82 to 2.9 million) people living with HIV/AIDS with an estimated adult HIV prevalence of 0.34% (0.25% - 0.43%). Nutritional Status

The nutritional status of women and children in India is not quite satisfactory and requires intervention to bring improvement in the current situation. Although programmes have targeted vulnerable sections of the population, further concerted effort is required to bring about tangible change in the situation. In spite of programmes like Public Distribution System and Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), poverty alleviation programmes and rural and urban employment programmes, the nutritional status of 35.6% women and 34.2% men is below normal. The benefits of programmes does not seem to reach about 35% of the population, hence a different approach is required. Persons having Body Mass Index below normal is given in Table 68.

From time to time, National Nutritional Monitoring Bureau undertakes surveys of the dietary intake of the population of India in various states and special groups, such as tribal and rural. National Institute of Nutrition conducted a survey of the diet and nutritional status of sections of the population in 9 states during 2004-05. The consumption of all foods except roots and tubers was below the RDI in all the age/sex/physiological groups. The consumption of protective foods such as pulses, green leafy vegetables (GLV), milk and fruits was grossly inadequate. Consequently, the intake of micronutrients such as iron, vitamin A, riboflavin and folic acid were far below the recommended levels in all the age groups. Only 25% of the preschool and school age children were consuming diets adequate in protein and energy, the proportion of which was higher in adolescents (30-60%) and adults (70-80%). The nutritional status of children aged 1-5 years according to Gomez Classification is given in Table 78.

Nutrition of Adolescent Girls

Adolescent girls from vulnerable sections of society do not get adequate nutrition and are deficit in calories. Many adolescent girls are also anaemic. To improve the nutritional status of adolescent girls, the Ministry of Women and Child Development provides foodgrains to undernourished girls identified by the anganwadi worker. This programme was undertaken during 2005-06 on a pilot project basis and is being implemented in 51 identified districts. Two backward districts in major states are selected on the basis of ranking developed by the Rural Development Division of the Planning Commission. Free foodgrains at the rate of 6 kg per beneficiary per month are provided to underweight (less than 35 kg) adolescent girls (11-19 years). The foodgrains released under Nutrition Programme for Adolescent Girls is given in Table 85.

Kishori Shakti Yojana (KSY) addresses the needs of adolescent girls in the age group 11-18 years for self development, nutrition and health status, literacy and numerical skills, vocational skills, etc. Approximately 44 adolescent girls are benefited in 1 year in 1 KSY Block. Each project is sanctioned Rs.1.10 lakhs per block per year. The scheme has been extended to all 6108 ICDS Blocks operational in the country, and the total number of KSY Blocks sanctioned is given in Table 86.

7. Education

Education is a critical input in human resource development and is essential for the country's economic growth. A high literacy rate, especially of women, correlates with improvement in several socio-economic indicators, namely low birth rate, low IMR and increase in life expectancy. The recognition of this fact has created awareness on the need to focus on improving literacy and universalizing elementary education. The task of providing basic education to all, with concrete plans of action, gained greater momentum only after the National Policy of Education (NPE) was adopted in 1986 and revised in 1992.

Primary education was earlier a State subject under the Constitution, but it has been brought under the Concurrent List to enable both, the Centre and State, to undertake measures to achieve universalization of primary education. The Supreme Court of India, in the Unnikrishnan Case (1993), declared primary education to be a fundamental right. The Constitution (86th Amendment) Act, 2002, was enacted by the Parliament of India making education a fundamental right. The Right to Education Act was enacted in 2006 to provide free and compulsory education to all children in the age group 6-14 years.

With the World Declaration on Education for All (EFA) adopted in Jomtien, Thailand in 1990, basic education in all its facets - Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE), Elementary Education, Education for Adolescents, Adult Education, Gender Equality and Quality Improvement - was recognised as a fundamental right of every citizen. The nation is firmly committed to providing Education for All, the priority areas being free and compulsory primary education, covering children with special needs, eradication of illiteracy, vocationalisation, education for women's equality, and special focus on the education of SCs/STs/OBCs and minorities.

Major programmes of the Department of Education are Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, District Primary Education Programme, National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level, Prarambhik Shiksha Kosh, National Institute of Open Schooling, Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Mahila Samakhya, National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (Mid-Day Meals), and other schemes which accord priority to areas of concentration of SCs, STs, OBCs and minorities.

The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), the National Programme for Universalisation of Elementary Education for children in the age group 6-14 years, was launched by the Government of India in mission mode in partnership with the States and Union Territories. Apart from providing quality elementary education, the SSA also focuses on providing free textbooks for girls, constructing toilets especially for girls, and setting up Village Education Committees and Mother Teacher Associations to monitor the quality of education. During the Eleventh Five Year Plan period, efforts are on to retain children upto middle school and provide Mid Day Meals till Class VIII.

The literacy rate has been going up steadily, and the Census of India 2001 revealed that while the total literacy rate was 65 per cent, for women and girls it was 54 per cent. The literacy rate of the population aged 7 years and above is given in Table 87.

8. Women and Economy

With the advent of industrialization and modernization, women have assumed greater responsibility, both at home and in the world of work. This is reflected in the increasing work participation rate of women which was 19.7% in 1981 and rose to 25.7% in 2001. However, this is still low compared to male work participation rate, which was 52.6% in 1981 and 51.9 % in 2001.

The number of women in the reorganized sector was 4.95 million on 31st March 2001, of whom 2.86 million were in the public sector and 2.09 million were in the private sector. The number rose to 5.120 million on 31.03.2006, and of these women, 3.003 million were in the public sector and 2.118 million were in the private sector.



To increase employment among women, several initiatives have been taken by Government of India, and programmes have been launched for the economic empowerment of women. Some of these are Swawlamban; Support to Training and Employment Programme (STEP); Hostels for Working Women, with day care centres for their children; Rashtriya Mahila Kosh (RMK); and Swayamsiddha.

Swawlamban

The Swawlamban programme, previously also called Women's Economic Programme and NORAD scheme, was launched in 1982-83 with assistance from the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (NORAD) to provide training and skills to women to facilitate them to obtain employment or self-employment. The target group under the scheme are poor and needy women and women from weaker sections of society, such as scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

Under the programme, financial assistance is provided to Women's Development Corporations (WDCs), public sector corporations, autonomous bodies and voluntary organizations (NGOs) to train poor women, mostly in non-traditional trades and to ensure their employment in these areas. Some of the popular trades under the programme are computer programming, desktop publishing, medical transcription, electronics, watch assembling, radio and television repairs, garment making, dress designing and fashion technology, handloom weaving, secretarial practice, community health work, embroidery, etc., and the aim is to make women self – reliant.

Financial assistance is also provided to the grantee organizations for hiring of training-cum-production sheds, training cost, machinery and equipments, stipend to the trainees and remuneration for the trainers.

Various evaluation studies have shown that nearly 50-60 per cent of the women trained under the programme have been able to get employment or self-employment. From 2006, Swawlamban has been transferred to the States/ Union Territories.

Support to Training and Employment Programme for Women (STEP)

Support to Training and Employment Programme for Women (STEP) was launched in 1987 to provide skills and knowledge to poor and assetless women in traditional occupations such as agriculture, animal husbandry, dairying, fisheries, handloom, handicrafts, khadi and village industries, sericulture, social forestry and wasteland development for enhancing their productivity and income generation. This would enhance and broaden their employment opportunities, including self-employment and development of entrepreneurship skills. Women beneficiaries are organized into co-operatives. Services such as training, extension, infrastructure, market linkages, etc. are provided, besides linkage with credit for transfer of assets.

Women in the dairying sector have been receiving the maximum support, keeping in view the nature of demands. This is followed by handlooms, handicrafts, sericulture and poultry.

The funds released for women beneficiaries under STEP are given in Table 121.

Rashtriya Mahila Kosh (National Credit Fund for Women)

Several research studies had repeatedly highlighted the need of poor women to have access to credit facilities at reasonable interest rates. It was felt that the credit needs of poor assetless women, particularly those in the unorganized sector who could offer no collateral and were not eligible for loans under banks schemes, had not been addressed adequately by the formal financial institutions in the country. Varied experiences in this sector had established a need for a quasi-informal credit delivery mechanism, which should be client friendly, have simple and minimal procedures, have flexible repayment schedules, and low transaction costs, both for the borrower and the lender. With this in mind, the Government of India established Rashtriya Mahila Kosh (National Credit Fund for Women) on 30th March 1993 to facilitate credit support and provide loans or micro-finance to women for setting up small enterprises. Rashtriya Mahila Kosh mainly channelizes its support through non-government organizations (NGOs) having experience of extending credit facilities to poor women, Women Development Corporations (WDCs), women cooperative societies, and suitable state government agencies. RMK, which started with an initial corpus of Rs.310 million has been recycled four times and the cumulative loaning operation was Rs.1780 million in 2006. The number of women beneficiaries and loans disbursed under RMK is given in Table 122.

9. Support Services to Women

Some of the support measures for women initiated by the Government of India are given below.

Hostels for Working Women

With progressive change in the economic structure of the country, more and more women are living out of their homes in search of employment in big cities. These women are exposed to risks due to lack of suitable and safe accommodation. The Government of India acknowledged the difficulties faced by such women and decided to introduce a Scheme for Construction / Expansion of Hostels for Working Women.

Under the Scheme for Construction / Expansion of Hostel Building for Working Women, financial assistance is given to voluntary organizations, local bodies and cooperative institutions for the construction of hostels for working women in order to enable women to seek employment and participate in technical training. The objective of the scheme is to provide cheap and safe hostel accommodation to working women living out of their homes. The target beneficiaries are single working women, widows, divorcees, separated women, and working women, whose husbands are out of town.

So far 876 working women's hostels (WWH) have been sanctioned throughout the country. In 2008-09, additional 11 new working women's hostels were sanctioned benefiting 933 women. The number of working women's hostels sanctioned, number of working women benefited, hostels with day care centres, and number of children benefited till March 2009 is given in Table 125.

Swayamsidha Scheme

Swayamsidha is an integrated scheme for empowerment of women through formation of self help groups (SHGs). The scheme was launched in February 2001 and aimed for holistic empowerment of women through sustained mobilization and convergence of all the on-going sectoral programmes by improving access of women to micro credit, economic resources, bank linkages, etc. The scheme culminated in March 2008. Against a target of 65,000 SHGs, 69,803 SHGs were formed and 1 million women covered under the scheme. The number of SHGs formed under Swayamsidha is given in Table 126.

Short Stay Homes

The Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB) has implemented the scheme of Short Stay Homes (SSH), which provide temporary shelter to women and girls who i) are being forced into prostitution, ii) are, as a result of family tension or discord, made to leave their homes and are without any means of subsistence and have no social protection from exploitation, or are facing litigation on account of marital disputes, iii) have been sexually assaulted and are facing the problem of re-adjustment in the family or society, iv) are victims of mental maladjustment, emotional disturbances and social ostracism, v) have escaped from their homes due to family problems, mental or physical torture and need shelter, psychiatric treatment and counselling for their rehabilitation and re-adjustment in family and society.

ICDS

The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) is a centrally sponsored scheme, wherein the Central Government is responsible for programme planning and operating costs, and the State Governments are responsible for programme implementation and supplementary nutrition.

The Scheme aims at the holistic development of children (0-6 years) and pregnant and nursing mothers. It provides an integrated comprehensive package of services comprising i) supplementary nutrition; ii) immunization; iii) health check-ups; iv) referral services; v) pre-school non-formal education; and vi) nutrition and health education.

The ICDS Scheme was introduced in 33 blocks in 1975 and expanded to 7073 sanctioned projects in March 2009, of which 6120 projects became fully operational till March 2009 (Ministry of Women and Child Development, ICDS Cell).

Currently, services under the scheme are being provided to about 72.196 million children and 15.147 million pregnant and nursing mothers as on 31 March 2009, through a network of anganwadi centres.

Creches

Creches directly benefit children in the preschool age by providing preschool education, supplementary nutrition and opportunities for psychosocial development and recreation. They also indirectly benefit mothers by giving them an opportunity to join the workforce, as creche workers look after the children, while mothers are at work. Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme for the Children of Working Mothers was launched on 1st January 2006 by merging the National Creche Fund and the Scheme of Assistance to Voluntary Organisations for Creches for Working and Ailing Mothers Children. The financial norms have been revised from Rs.18,480 to Rs.42,384 per crèche per annum, and the target is to set up 14,719 new crèches by the end of the 10th Five Year Plan. The number of creches and children availing services under Crèche Scheme are given in Table 129.

Condensed Courses of Education for Women (CCE)

The National Policy on Education has laid special emphasis on skill development for girls and women to provide employment or work opportunities in rural and urban areas. The Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB) started the programmes of Condensed Courses of Education in 1958 and the Vocational Training Programme during the year 1975, to help women complete their schooling and also upgrade their skills in order to meet the demands of changing work environment.

Under the scheme of Condensed Courses, voluntary organisations are given grants to conduct courses of 2 years and 1 year duration to enable women above 15 years to pass Matric/ Secondary, Middle and Primary level examinations. The scheme contains provisions for engaging teachers for conducting these courses.

The number of beneficiaries under the programme Condensed Courses of Education for Women is given in Table 130.

Swadhar

Swadhar was launched in 2001-2002 for the benefit of women in difficult circumstances, like destitute widows deserted by their families in religious places; women prisoners released from jail and without family support; women survivors of natural disasters who have been rendered homeless and are without any social and economic support; trafficked women/girls rescued or runaway from brothels, victims of sexual crimes, who are disowned by the family or who do not want to go back to their respective family for various reasons; women victims of terrorist violence who are without any family support and without any economic means of survival; mentally disordered women who are without any support of family or relatives, etc.

The package of assistance under the scheme includes provisions for shelter, food, clothing, health care and counselling for such women; measures for social and economic rehabilitation through education, awareness, skill upgradation and personality development through behavioural training, helpline for such women in distress, etc.

The implementing agencies can be the social welfare / women and child welfare departments of state governments, women's development corporations, urban local bodies, reputed public/ private trusts or voluntary organizations who are willing to take the responsibility of rehabilitating such women. In 2008-09, 287 Swadhar Shelter Homes were functional in the country.

The organizations assisted in implementing Swadhar scheme is given in Table 132.

Women's Helplines

Women's Helplines, which became operational since 2002-03, have been set up in many cities and towns to provide assistance to women in distress or in problem situations. The woman or anyone on her behalf can dial a toll-free number 1091 and receive information or guidance telephonically. During 2008-09, 100 new Swadhar Shelter Home/ Women Helplines have been sanctioned. Funds were also released to 146 ongoing cases (Swadhar Shelter Homes and Helplines) during 2008-09. At present 287 Swadhar Shelter Homes and 210 Women Helplines are functional across the country.

Awareness Generation Camps

The Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB) has been funding Awareness Generation Camps for women since 1986-87. Under this scheme, women are empowered by making them aware about their various rights, including legal rights, health rights, AIDS awareness, property and inheritance rights, etc. The number of beneficiaries and units assisted under Awareness Generation Scheme is given in Table 133.

Female Headed Households

The National Sample Survey Organization conducted a survey on the employment and unemployment situation in India in 2004-05. It was found that about 11% households in both rural and urban areas were headed by females. Compared to all households, they had, on an average, a relatively smaller household size and a much higher sex ratio. Female headed households are in need of special support services, as women have to fulfil both economic and domestic roles. The number of female headed households is given in Table 134.

10. Crime against Women and Children

Crimes against women have been increasing over the years. The reported crimes against women in 2008 were 195,856 (under IPC and SLL) compared to 185,312 during 2007, recording a marginal increase of 5.7% in 2008. Andhra Pradesh accounted for 12.3% of the total incidents of crime against women, and Uttar Pradesh accounted for 12.0% of the total crimes against women. About 95.3% of the crimes were IPC crimes and 4.7% were crimes under special and local laws (SLL). Although women may be victims of many crimes but rape is one of the most heinous crimes. Rape is defined under Section 375 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) as the unlawful and carnal knowledge by a man of a woman (a) against her will, (b) without her consent, (c) consent obtained by putting her in fear of hurt, (d) obtaining her consent by making her believe that she is his lawfully married wife, and (e) with or without her consent when she is under 16 years of age. Exception to Section 375 is the sexual intercourse by a man with his own wife, the wife not being under 15 years of age.

Punishment for Rape

Normal punishment for rape is minimum 7 to 10 years imprisonment and maximum life imprisonment and fine. Punishment for raping one's own wife, who is not under 12 years, is two years imprisonment or fine or both.

Public Interest Litigation

The Supreme Court has decreed that any citizen, can on behalf of any other person, petition the Court regarding any serious matter which involves the fundamental rights of a citizen of India. Even a letter addressed to the Court can be treated as a petition on which *suo moto* action can be initiated.

Lok Adalats

To redress the grievances or complaints of common citizens who wish to avoid lengthy, complicated, expensive court procedures, provision has been made to dispense justice through *Lok Adalats* or People's Courts, wherein a bench of judges (or tribunal) listens to the petitions and dispenses justice at the same time in accordance with law. This is a way of Courts moving out to people to provide speedy justice to the common man, and reducing the load of cases pending in Courts. Cases which pertain to minor charges can be settled out of Court in an informal atmosphere.

Child Rape

The incidence of crime against children was 22,500 in 2008 compared to 20,410 in 2007, reporting an increase of 10.2 per cent. The crime rate increased marginally from 1.8 in 2007 to 2.0 in 2008. The rate was highest in A & N Islands (11.3) followed by Delhi (10.7), D&N Haveli (6.4), Chandigarh (6.2) and Madhya Pradesh (6.1) as compared to the national average of 2.0. Among IPC crimes, child rape cases increased by 7.9%, from 5045 cases in 2007 to 5446 cases in 2008. Uttar Pradesh has reported the highest number of cases (900) followed by Madhya Pradesh (892) and Maharashtra (690) and accounted for 45.6% of the total child rape cases reported in the country. The incidence of child rape is given in Table 136.



DOWRY

Dowry, as defined in the Act, means any property or valuable security given or agreed to be given either directly or indirectly (a) by one party to a marriage to the other party to the marriage; or (b) by the persons of either party to a marriage or by any other person, to either party to the marriage or to any other person; at or before ³[or any time after the marriage] ⁴[in connection with the marriage of said parties but does not include] dower or *meher* in the case of persons to whom the Muslim Personal Law (*Shariat*) applies.

Punishment for Giving or Accepting Dowry : The person or persons guilty of giving or accepting dowry may be imprisoned for a minimum of five years and fined not less than Rs.15,000 or the amount of the value of the dowry – whichever is more.

Death of a woman is known as **dowry death**, when it is caused by any burns or bodily injury or occurs otherwise than under normal circumstances within seven years of her marriage and it is shown that soon before her death she was subjected to cruelty or harassment by her husband or any relative of her husband for, or in connection with, any demand for dowry.

Punishment for Dowry Death: A person guilty and convicted for dowry death can be jailed from seven years to life (20 years).

11. Gender Development Index

The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1979 to attain the goal of **equal rights for women**. Consisting of a preamble and 30 articles, it defines what constitutes discriminations against women and sets up an agenda for national action to end such discrimination. According to the Convention, discrimination against women is "... any distinction, exclusion or restriction made on the basis of sex which has the effect or purpose of impairing or nullifying the recognition, enjoyment or exercise by women, irrespective of their marital status, on a basis of equality of men and women, of human rights and fundamental freedoms in the political, economic, social, cultural, civil or any other field". The Convention ensures women's equal access to, and equal opportunities in, political and public life including right to vote and stand for election, as well as education and employment. It is the only human rights treaty which affirms the reproductive rights of women. The Convention, which entered into force on 3 September 1981, had till 31 May 1996, been ratified by 152 UN member states.

India ratified the Convention on 25 June 1993 with "Declaratory Statement" in respect of Articles 16(1) and Article 16(2) of the Convention and "Reservation" in respect of Article 29(1) of the Convention. Under Article 16(1) of the Convention, the Government of the Republic of India declared that it shall abide by and ensure these provisions in conformity with its policy of non-interference in the personal affairs of any community without its initiative and consent. Under Article 16(2) of the Convention, the Government of India declares that it agrees to the principle of compulsory registration of marriages. However, failure to get the marriage registered, will not invalidate the marriage, particularly in India, with its variety of customs, religions and literacy level. Article 29(1) of the Convention establishes compulsory arbitration or adjudication by the International Court of Justice of Disputes concerning interpretation. Government of India declares that it does not consider itself bound by paragraph 1 of this Article.

When India ratified the UN Convention to End Discrimination against Women in 1993, disaggregated data regarding the situation of women and girls was not available. Efforts were then initiated by the Government of India to collect disaggregated data on various indicators so that a clearer picture of the situation of women and girls vis-à-vis men and boys would emerge. Data at the district and sub-district level are required for planning programmes based on facts at the micro level. The Gender Development Index (GDI) of Indian women is illustrated by the statistics given below in Table 159.

12. Political Participation of Women and Women in Decision Making

The 73rd and 74th Amendment to the Constitution ensured that 33 per cent seats for panchayats in rural areas and urban local bodies were to be reserved for women. This ensured the direct involvement of women in positions of decision making. Elected women representatives are slowly bringing change in the rural countryside and urban areas, by bringing social development, women and child related issues to the forefront.

14. Household Consumer Expenditure

The National Sample Survey (NSS) collects some basic information on various indicators. The present report is based on the data on consumer expenditure collected during the NSS 63th Round (July 2006 – June 2007). The main findings discuss the pattern of variation of monthly per capita consumer expenditure over rural and urban areas of selected States, including the North- Eastern States, and the Group of Union Territories.

The all-India average Monthly Per Capita Consumer Expenditure (MPCE) was Rs.695 in rural areas and Rs.1312 in urban areas. Thus, the average MPCE for urban areas at all India level was higher than that in rural areas.

The average expenditure per person per month on various items in rural and urban areas is given in Table 176.

15. Budget Outlay

The Central Government expenditure on social sectors, namely education, health and family welfare, water supply, sanitation, housing, rural development, social welfare, nutrition and minimum basic services as a ratio to total expenditure rose from 9.4 per cent in 1993-94 to 11.4 per cent in 1999-2000. The Central outlay on women and child development increased by 104.8 per cent in the Tenth Five Year Plan (2002-07) over the Ninth Five Year Plan, from Rs.6729 crores to Rs.13,780 crores. The Ninth Plan 1997-2002 made two significant changes in the conceptual strategy for planning for women. Firstly, "empowerment of women" became one of the nine primary objectives of the Ninth Plan, and secondly the plan attempted convergence of existing services, resources, infrastructure and manpower available in both, women – specific and women – related sectors. To this effect, it directed both the Centre and the States to adopt a special strategy of "Women's Component Plan" through which not less than 30 per cent of funds/benefits should be earmarked in all the women - related sectors. In the Ninth Plan, the Women's Component Plan as a percentage of the Gross Budgetary Support (GBS) worked out to be 25.5. In 1986, at the instance of the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), a special mechanism of monitoring 27 Beneficiary Oriented Schemes (BOS) for women was put into action. The same continues to be an effective instrument for monitoring women specific and women related sectors of health, nutrition, education, labour, rural development, urban development, science and technology, and women and child development. The Tenth Plan translated gender commitment into budgetary commitment to ensure that women receive their rightful share from all women and women – related general development sectors. The Approach Paper to the Eleventh Plan states that adequate provisions need to be made in policies and schemes to achieve gender equity. Impediments need to be removed and an enabling environment provided to achieve just gender goals. Budget allocations for various Ministries, Departments, schemes and programmes are given in Table 179.

As the world entered the new millennium, heads of state and government gathered at the United Nations General Assembly to lay out their vision for the United Nations Millennium Declaration, recognizing their “collective responsibility to uphold the principles of human dignity, equality and equity at the global level”. Among the many objectives set out by the declaration are specific, quantified and monitorable goals for development and poverty eradication by 2015 A.D. These goals are:

- To halve the proportion of the world's people living on less than \$ 1 a day.
- Halve the proportion of people living in extreme poverty.
- Halve the proportion of people suffering from hunger.
- Halve the proportion of people without access to safe water and basic sanitation.
- Enrol all children in primary school, and ensure universal completion of primary schooling.
- Empower women and eliminate gender disparities in primary and secondary education.
- Reduce maternal mortality ratios by three-quarters.
- Reduce infant mortality rates by two-thirds.^a
- Reduce under-five mortality rates by two-thirds.
- Halt and begin to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDS.
- Halt and reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases (tuberculosis, etc).
- Provide access for all who want reproductive health services.^a
- Implement national strategies for sustainable development by 2005 to reverse the loss of environmental resources by 2015.^a
