

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

In continuation of Office Memorandum No.NI/Acctts-III/I/01/2022-23 dated 21.11.2022, guidelines for obtaining treatment from the AMA/recognized Hospitals under CS(MA) Rules, 1944 are as under:

S.No	Particulars facility	Procedure
1	Appointment of AMA/ Specialist Rule-2(10)	(a). All the Regional Centres are required to nominate sufficient number of Doctors only among the list of AMAs approved by the Chairman, Central Govt. Employees' Welfare Coordination Committee (CGEWCC) of the respective Cities/Areas. (b). A consolidated list of the Doctors so selected from the nearby geographical areas of their residence/Office may be sent to the NIPCCD Headquarters for approval of the same by the Competent Authority. (c). The duration/validity of such approved panel would be for a period of one year or as may be approved by the CGEWCC extendable for further years subject to approval of the Competent Authority.
2	Choosing of AMA Rule-2 (3) (iv)(a)	The Govt. employee is expected to consult an AMA(s) nearest to his residence. He/she can choose any two AMAs from the list of AMAs and give an option in writing the name(s) of the AMA(s) including specialists to the respective controlling Authorities in advance and get it approved.
3	Consultation Charges payable to the AMAs	The existing fee structure approved by the Executive Council shall be in force.
4	Inpatient treatment in the Private Hospitals approved under the CS(MA)/CGHS Rule- (6)(2)	The employees and their family members requiring hospitalization can directly take admission for in-patient treatment in Hospitals where he is ordinarily entitled to receive treatment under the rules, i.e. In a hospital to which had he would be admitted and he consulted his AMA, under intimation to the respective AMA and the Head of the Office except emergency treatment.
5	Duration of treatment and Reimbursement of Medical expenditure against the Bills submitted	The existing NIPCCD Rules shall be in force.

6	Treatment outside normal duty satiation from private AMAs (Rule - 2(3)(c))	The Govt. employees and their entitled family members are not entitled to take treatment from the AMAs outside their normal duty station. However, for any reason they require medical treatment, they should obtain treatment from the nearest Government and other hospitals/dispensaries recognized under the CS (MA) Rules under intimation to the respective AMA and the Head of the Office.
7	Treatment which requires several consultations and injections spread over a period of more than 10 days	The employee should get the referral from the AMA for the treatment in the out-patient department of any nearest Government/recognized hospital if the treatment requires more than 10 days. However, at the discretion of the AMA, the treatment and injections can be administered within a period of maximum 15 days. If the treatment obtained is from Indian System of medicines and Homeopathy, the duration of treatment cannot exceed 40 days.
8	Medical Treatment facilities to the retired employees and their dependents of the NIPCCD	The retiree may choose any two AMAs from the list approved by the CGEWCC or they may nominate any two Doctors/Specialists from the private medical practitioners of the respective areas and send such list to HQrs/RCs for obtaining prior approval from the Competent Authority.
9	Dental Treatment	Dental treatment can only be obtained from Govt. Hospital or nearest recognized private Hospitals under the CGHS/CS (MA) Rules on the advice of AMA.

2. The above guidelines are subject to change by NIPCCD Headquarters in accordance to the amendments in the CS (MA) Rules 1944 formulated by the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India from time to time. All other related rules and line of treatment prescribed in the CS (MA) rules 1944 shall also strictly apply. The above rules and procedure given above shall be applicable from the date of issue of this Office Memorandum.

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
